They have a snack with friends and return home thinking that this feel-good ritual leaves them in good standing with an all mighty and holy God. Yet Matthew 7:21-23 makes it sadly and horrifyingly clear, not everyone who says "Lord, Lord, shall enter the kingdom of heaven." It clearly states that Jesus will tell many, "I never knew you, depart from me." This terrifying portion of scripture is not referring to atheists and criminals. It is referring to people who refer to Jesus as Lord! Who claim to have prophesied and done miracles in His name! These are people that obviously participated in church life. How can this be? How can church members and church leaders be rejected by Jesus? I believe that this will be the result of many lukewarm hearts that have filled many lukewarm churches.

Our country is experiencing a morality crisis that I believe is a result of this lukewarm Christianity. The purpose of the church is not to have feel good get togethers. It is not a social or cultural club. It is not a place to network or to gain social standing. The Church of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ is a place that should lead us to a sacrificial devotion to our Lord, to His Word and to His commands.

Certainly, attending church and being around our Christian brothers and sisters can and does bring great joy. Singing worship songs together and hearing from God's word brings great pleasure and comfort. Yet, if we are not careful this comfortable environment can become what we strive for and desire. This can lead to a lukewarm church that places its congregants and leaders in eternal peril. A true church and true discipleship require a commitment to the authority of scripture. Not just reading the bible for its wonderful words and stories but obeying and living out its commands. The church and its congregants must guard against becoming like the sinful culture around us. A culture that constantly bombards us with messages of seeking the will of self over the will of God. Breaking free of the world around us does not come easily or naturally.
