God Works For Us

For a long time, the Israelites were slaves in Egypt. God sent Moses as a spiritual leader and asked Egypt's king to let the Israelites go to Canaan. Egypt's king, Pharaoh, did not want to let them go, so he refused their requests. God sent 10 plagues and finally Pharaoh allowed the Israelites to go. However, after Pharaoh said the Israelites could go, he changed his mind. He commanded the Egyptian army to chase the Israelites and catch them again. The Israelites saw that the Egyptian army was chasing them, but they could not go any further because the Red Sea was in their path. The Israelites were in trouble because at their back was the Egyptian army and in front of them was the Red Sea.

Then what happened?

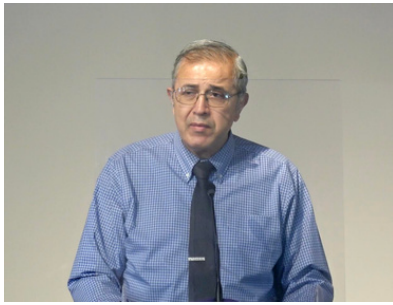
In Exodus chapter 14, Moses stretched out his hand over the sea. The Lord drove the sea back by a strong east wind all night and turned the sea into dry land, and the waters were divided. When Moses prayed to God, God answered and was with the Israelites. Before Moses prayed, there was no way, but after Moses prayed, God showed the way.

Continually in the Bible, the Israelites went into the sea on dry ground, the waters forming a wall for them on their right and on their left. The Egyptians pursued, and went into the sea after them. At the morning watch the Lord in the pillar of fire and cloud looked down upon the Egyptian army and threw the Egyptian army into panic. It was the same place but had a different meaning from God's works. The Bible says that the Israelites went into the dry land and the Egyptians went into the sea. It was the same place and the same time, but with totally different results. God leads your life in God's way.

In the Bible, the Israelites walked on dry ground through the sea, the waters forming a wall for them on their right and on their left. Thus the Lord saved Israel that day from the Egyptians, and Israel saw the Egyptians dead on the seashore. Israel saw the great work that the Lord did against the Egyptians. So the people feared the Lord and believed in the Lord and in his servant Moses.

The water was the problem for the Israelites, but God used the water to stop the Egyptians' attack. When Moses stretched out his hand over the sea again, the water returned to its normal depth, and the Egyptians fell into the water and died. Not one of them remained. God made the water a wall for them on their right and their left. The water was the problem for the Israelites, but it was also the solution to overcome the problematic situation.

When Jesus came to the earth, people disagreed that He was the Messiah. Priests, Pharisees, and Scribes who were religious leaders attacked Jesus. Jesus could avoid the difficulties, but Jesus endured it all to follow God's will. People framed Jesus and had him crucified by lying about Him. Jesus died on the cross. Jesus broke the power of death and rose again. He died so that He could be resurrected. Jesus shows us what real life is. Jesus proved God's plan and showed us God's love and mercy. The cross was the biggest problem, but Jesus' cross proved God's great love and forgiveness of our sins. Jesus saved us by the blood of the cross and the new life of His resurrection. The cross was converted to the sign of God's love and salvation. The way of the cross is narrow and rigid, but it is the only way to life in Jesus. Remember that God always works for you in God's time. Believe in God. God will protect you in God's hands.
