"I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile. For in the gospel a righteousness from God is revealed, a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: " The righteous will live by faith." (Romans 1:16-17)

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ Jesus,

I hope and pray that this season of fall will bring many blessed things to us. As a disciple of Jesus Christ, October always reminds me of the Reformation. On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther issued his Ninety-five Theses in Wittenberg and began the Protestant Reformation. It began Protestant Reformation. Martin Luther said, "Many have taken the Christian faith to be a simple and easy matter, and have even numbered it among the virtues. This is because they have not really experienced it, nor have they tested the great strength of faith." Romans 1: 16-17 changed Martin Luther's life forever. Martin Luther was a German theologian and leader of the Reformation. Thanks to his contributions, the Protestant Church emerged from the Roman Catholic Church.

One day, Martin Luther began to climb up the steps of a Cathedral on his knees to be saved by his efforts. In the midst of his penance, the Word of God grasped him. It was Romans 1:17, saying, "The one who is righteous will live by faith." Martin Luther said, "This passage in Paul became the very gate of paradise to me." "Faith alone and the Scripture alone" were the catch phrases of the Reformation. Martin Luther believed that salvation would be granted on the basis of faith.

How could Martin Luther lead the Reformation? Martin Luther experienced the power of the Gospel of Jesus Christ through his whole being.

In verse 16, St. Paul says, "I am not ashamed of the Gospel, because it is the power of God for the Salvation of everyone who believes." St. Paul always experienced the Gospel of Jesus Christ as power.

Many of us have come to church for many years. I wonder whether we have experienced Jesus Christ as our power. Every Sunday, we hear God's message. I wonder whether we experience God's message as power. I wonder whether we experience God's Word as power.

What power does the Bible tell us? The word "power" in English is "Dunamis" in Greek, the New Testament. The word "dynamite" in English comes from the word "Dunamis" in the Bible. The Gospel of Jesus Christ is the greatest power that can break through everything. But let us not misunderstand that the power of the Gospel controls others in violent force.

The power of the Gospel of Jesus Christ has the power to change our hearts and our lives with grace and love. Only the power of the Gospel of Jesus Christ has the power to defeat a force of Satan.

God calls us for the powerful witnesses of the Gospel of Jesus Christ to transform the world around us. Let us experience the power of the Gospel of Jesus Christ like dynamite explodes in us. Let us become the powerful and passionate disciples of Jesus Christ like Saint Paul as we remember the Reformation.

May God reform us with the power of the Gospel in Jesus Christ! Pastor Lee

New York Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church

Dear Friends and Colleagues,

It was just a short five years ago that I wrote to you about the devastation that Hurricane Maria caused in the Caribbean, especially Puerto Rico, killing thousands and triggering one of the largest blackouts in U.S. history. Our Annual Conference responded in a substantial way by generating resources, sending work teams and providing a strong sense of solidarity by praying for the communities affected by the storm.

Just a few days ago, Hurricane Fiona struck Puerto Rico again, creating flooding, landslides, power outages and water shortages. The damage is still being assessed, but we have heard from our partners in Puerto Rico that the Southeast part of the Island is the most affected. Many roads are currently closed cutting off essential supply chains.

In Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands, The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), our primary disaster response agency, provides support for relief supplies and other commodities. They are also prepared to offer additional support through funding, training, and project development once specific needs are identified. REHACE, a nonprofit organization of the Methodist Church of Puerto Rico, has partnered with UMCOR to provide immediate response in the communities. Currently, they are organizing Centers for those displaced by the storm and community dining rooms as they continue to evaluate the needs created by the storm.

I am asking that all our congregations designate Sunday, October 15, for a special offering in support of UMCOR's and our Conference's response effort in this area. Please send your contributions directly to the New York Annual Conference Center. Make your checks payable to NYAC and include "Bishop's Appeal - Hurricane Fiona" in the memo line.

Given the deep connections that New York Conference churches and communities have with Puerto Rico, I request that we make this response effort a priority for us as a Conference and for our local churches.

Rev. Nikki Hutt, our Conference Mission and Disaster Response Coordinator, will continue to monitor the situation and provide guidance in the specific and additional ways that we may be called upon to respond. When appropriate, we will organize the deployment volunteer recovery teams into the areas. As in any emergency situation, we must wait for the National Guard and first responders to take the lead. Our opportunity to organize recovery teams will and should only occur after receiving the appropriate clearances. We want to ensure that we maximize our efforts and the safety of our people traveling into the region. For now, the best way for us to respond is through this financial appeal.

Please intentionally pray for all those impacted by disasters throughout our country and the world. And once again, stay strong, keep the faith, and know that you are thought of, prayed for, and loved.
