### March Newsletter

"Don't be alarmed," he said. You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. (Mark 16:6)

In this month of March, we're moving through the Passion Week of Lent and into Easter Sunday. As we move through Holy Week and into Easter, amidst the complexities of our world, the message of Christ's resurrection remains as relevant and transformative as ever. In our everyday lives, often filled with despair and uncertainty, the Easter story offers us a beacon of hope and a reminder of the power of new beginnings.

In the Gospel of Mark, we encounter the familiar scene of Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome journeying to the tomb of Jesus on that first Easter morning. They were somber, laden with grief, as they carried spices to anoint the body of their beloved Lord and Savior. However, what they encountered exceeded their expectations: the heavy stone had been shifted, revealing an empty tomb, as a mysterious figure clothed in white declared a message of resurrection.

The heavy stone that blocked the tomb entrance symbolizes our own sense of helplessness in the face of death and the challenges of life. In a world where death seems to surround us at every turn and where violence, injustice, and suffering are rampant, it's easy to feel overwhelmed and powerless. Yet, the Easter message reminds us that God's power transcends even the greatest obstacles. The resurrection of Jesus demonstrates that death does not have the final word: life triumphs over death, and hope conquers despair.

Easter isn't just about looking back at past events; it's about looking forward with anticipation and hope.

The risen Christ isn't confined to the pages of history; he goes ahead of us, leading us into an unknown future filled with promise and possibility. As we navigate through the challenges of our time be it political unrest, social injustice, or personal struggles—we can take courage in the assurance that the Risen Christ is with us, guiding us towards a brighter tomorrow.

In a world hungry for hope, the message of Easter compels us to take action. Just as the women at the tomb were instructed to go and tell the disciples the good news, we too are called to proclaim the message of resurrection to all who will listen. Let us not be paralyzed by fear or doubt, but let us boldly declare that Christ is risen and that the Risen Christ's resurrection offers hope and new life to all who believe.

As we celebrate Easter in 2024, may we be reminded of the timeless truth of the resurrection: that in the midst of darkness, light shines forth; in the face of despair, hope abounds. Let us embrace this message with joy and gratitude, trusting in the power of the Risen Christ to transform our lives and our world. Amen.

### Stewards for God's Ministry in 2024



Luke 16:1-13, NRSV A Reflection for the Lenten Season Sung-ok Lee, Finance Chair

To belong to a church congregation is to be a steward. Some may say that "stewardship" is just a polite way of referring to financial giving to the church. But it's far more than that. Jesus speaks in many parables. One character in Jesus's parables is the STEWARD — the servant charged by the master to care for the master's property. The master owns the land and the steward is responsible for taking care and tilling the soil, sowing seeds and growing fruits from the seeds. Jesus teaches us we have three (3) responsibilities and joys as God's STEWARDS:

 Receiving: We receive with joyful thanksgiving the many gifts that God showers upon us — time, talent, treasure, our friendships, natural resources, and the beauty around us.
Managing: We take good care of what we have received. We manage these resources wisely — for our own good and the good of others.
Giving: Out of our gratitude in receiving so abundantly, we are to share with others.

We may think that our financial resources are our own. But we are the Stewards; God is the owner. So what we earn, how we earn it, how we save, spend, and give away, are all matters of Christian stewardship. One aspect of stewardship is our GIVING to God's mission in the world through the church. We've learned that giving is most effective when we commit ourselves to give a definite proportion of our income through the church. For many, this proportion is one-tenth, or a tithe. Whatever the amount, we have discovered the joy in giving to God the "first fruits," an amount "off the top" of our income, not what's left over at the end of the month. Once again in 2024, may the Holy spirit work in us to be God's good stewards.
