

Bayside VBS FAQs

Are your classes separated by grade?

Yes, all of our classes are separated by the grade your child will be entering in September.

At what age or grade does my child have to be in order to register?

Any and all children must be going into Pre-K or a higher grade. Please note we do not accommodate children in 3K or younger.

What time is drop off and pick up?

Our drop off time is between 8am and 9am, while our pick up time is between 5pm and 6pm. Drop off and pickup can be done anytime within these hour long time frames.

Do I have to pack lunch for my child?

We offer breakfast, lunch, and snacks in our facility for all children. If you would like to pack your child lunch, you are more than welcome to.

What accommodations do you guys offer?

All of our classrooms each have their own air conditioner as well as a water purifier/dispenser. Bathrooms are available for use on the first and second floors. Wheelchair accessible bathrooms are located on the second floor.

What should my child bring to camp?

Backpacks, water bottles, pencils, and t-shirts will be provided on site, so your child does not need to bring anything.

What documentation is required before camp starts?

All registration forms and a medical form should be submitted prior to the start of camp. Please note that a medical form is required before the start of camp.

What is the supervision ratio?

Our supervision ratio for campers age 5 and younger are 1 to 6. For campers aged 6 to 7, the ratio is 1 to 9. For campers aged 8 and above, the ratio is 1 to 12.

Do all of your staff have background checks?

Yes, all of our employees, teachers, and staff members are screened and put through the DCJS sex offender registry.

Is your camp NYC DOE licensed?

Yes, Bayside VBS is a NYC licensed summer program.

What qualifications do staff have?

All directors, co directors, operators, as well as some staff are CPR+AED certified as well as first aid certified. Director's also hold Fire Safety and Fire Drill certifications. There will be a health director as well as an onsite designee at all times of operation.
